NO-VISITOR POLICY IN EFFECT

NO VISITORS WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- Inpatient Nursing Units
- Intensive Care Unit
- Emergency Department-New Lenox and Homer Glen

- Pediatric patients and patients with altered mental status or communication difficulties may have 1 designated parent, guardian or significant other accompany them in the waiting and treatment areas. *Special exceptions may be made by nursing unit managers or their designee based upon patient presentation or other needs, such as end-of-life care.*

PROCEDURAL CARE

Procedural Care patients may have 1 designated visitor in the PCU Lounge during the procedure. However, if the patient requires admission, visitation is not permitted during the patient's hospital stay.

LABOR/DELIVERY UNIT AND NEONATAL AND PEDIATRIC UNITS

1 designated visitor is allowed during the duration of a patient's hospital stay.

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

1 designated visitor is permitted during a patient's outpatient testing or procedure. If the patient is admitted to the hospital, visitation will not be permitted.

*These restrictions will be in place until further notice for the safety of our patients, staff and community. **Permitted visitors must screen negative and remain masked AT ALL TIMES.***

YOU MUST WEAR A MASK

Mandatory Masking

Everyone coming into the hospital and/or hospital areas must mask at all times. You are encouraged to bring your own face mask (surgical/cloth). If you do not have a mask, we will provide one. Visitors will be required to wear a mask that covers their nose and mouth upon entry and **keep it on at all times while at the hospital without exception.** This is to protect our patients, staff and visitors.
